Because United Way's 2-1-1 connects people more efficiently to the many resources that can help them, local governments benefit. During disasters, 2-1-1 relieves the pressure on 911 by responding to non-emergency calls with up-to-the-minute information on shelters, driving conditions and other disaster-related questions, allowing 911 to respond to life-and-death situations more quickly.

Hope for the Homeless and Hungry: Low income residents, particularly in a tough economy, battle to make ends meet every month. To pay for a child's medication might mean that someone making minimum wage can't make a rent payment. For that individual or family to be evicted would have grave, multi-level consequences for their futures and for the community.

United Way works with Westchester Coalition for the Hungry and Homeless, a clearing house for low-income Westchester residents who receive help to prevent eviction. The clearing house makes sure that funds are distributed fairly and equitably, on an emergency basis, so that more people have the necessary help to keep them in their homes.

Hope for the Homeless and Hungry also helps the community understand the needs and services that surround important community issues like hunger and homelessness.
